With reference to the following letter, received from Rev. W.M. Tarahan, R.C. Pastor, Trinity, Newfoundland, dated 4/8/18:

Noted, and Rev. Fr. Tarahan has been duly notified

"Messrs.

Minister of Militia.

"On this the 4th Anniversary of the terrible world war I am earnestly requested by an afflicted family of one of our soldiers Prisoners in Germany to endeavour to obtain an answer to his pressing request for food and clothing.

The young man's name is Andrew Shaw of L. Heart's Base, Trinity Bay, Nfld. His address sent from his imprisonment in Germany is, Soltau Z 3605, Baracke No. 12, Provinz Hannover, Deutschland.

This young soldier of Newfoundland is enlisted since the first of the war or thereabout, was once or twice wounded and finally disappeared in April drive and after a time turned up in Germany. His parents lost in him and a brother who died in winter their chief support, and are now grieved (being sick withal) to be obtaining requests for food and clothing which they must depend on others to furnish.

In a recent letter he asks them to apply to The Red Cross Fund Regimental Depot, and to-day a returned soldier directs me to apply to your Office and state the case. 'Tis a pity that Germany being short of food and clothing cannot find a way to release prisoners like him - he is wounded and his family need him. Will you kindly do what possible in the circumstances!"

will you kindly inform him that as  
soon as it was known in this office  
that Pte. Shaw was a prisoner, i.e.  
on 12/8/18, steps were at once taken  
to send him parcels of food and  
clothing.

I may add, for your own information,  
that application has been put to the  
War Office, for transmission to the  
Imperial German Government, for the  
transfer of this man to a neutral  
country or to England, as he appears  
to be badly wounded in the leg.  
Possibly it may not be advisable  
to inform Pte. Shaw's people, pending  
further developments, please.
