He applied for his discharge from the Regiment in order to join the Forestry Companies, and presumably, did not have time or opportunity to transfer his Allotment, which was at the rate of 60cts. per day, to his mother.

It is reasonable to suppose, that either Sheehan did not have the opportunity to transfer his Allotment, or else, that he considered it would be automatically transferred, from the Regiment to the Forestry Companies, without action on his part.
