Dear Sir:-

I am writing to ask you whether anything can be done to assist one of your returned boys Private Leonard Sheppard? He was wounded on July 1st. 1916 at Beaumont Hamel and has been in and out of hospitals for nearly three years. He has been home now for 18 months and the Medical Authorities in St. John's cannot do very much for him except take the leg off he ^{doesn't} ~~doesn't~~ want this and he believes that if he could get to New York or London his leg could be saved. He wrote to Dr. Parsons and the Dr. replied that if he would pay his passage both ways then the "Pension Board" would see to the rest. But surely the Government could help the man out in full. He has no money of his own. I am a strong supporter of the Government acting as foster parent to every man who wants all sorts of odd things done, but I think this is a matter of national importance. Men who have sacrificed life and limb in the service of their country ought in common justice be taken proper care of. Sheppard feels it to be rather hard and has written strongly to Dr. Parsons on the subject. I sincerely hope you will give this case your earnest consideration.

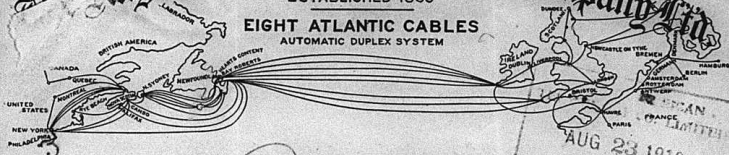

Dear Mr. Higitt,

I am in receipt of your letter of the 18th instant, with the messages to Mrs. Sheppard, Harbor Grace. The two messages are really correct, and the confusion has arisen because of the longer period which the official message takes to reach here. The Hospital informs the War Office and then the War Office passes the news to Captain Timewell at the Record Office, but as there are so many thousands of reports of like nature going through, it takes from a week to ten days for the reports from the Hospital to reach St. John's through the various intermediary agencies.

In the case of the request which I wired to Captain Timewell he goes direct to the Hospital and we have quite a number of cases where his report has been much quicker than the official report. You will notice that in the present case that the official report gives Lance Corporal Sheppard as dangerously ill on the 6th August. Captain Timewell's report gives Lance Corporal Sheppard progressing favourably on say the 14th or 15th August, and these are really the facts.

With the thousands of Casualties going through and the numerous enquiries, you will appreciate that the War Office cannot get through the news very quickly. In the same way, though perhaps not to the same extent, Captain Timewell is handicapped, and you will notice that it takes him about ten days, in a great many cases, to forward replies to our direct queries. Captain Timewell has intimated, more than once,

that

that when large lists of Casualties are going through, it is almost impossible to attend to enquiries regarding wounded soldiers. You may depend upon it, however, that the best is done that is possible under the circumstances.

The enclosed two messages were rec'd here yesterday. Can you explain the discrepancy? Is there a mistake as to the person who is meant? The two messages cannot both be true. The same thing happened before. On Aug 1st a ~~letter~~^{telegram} was received from you saying that Ice-bpl Sheppard was seriously ill. On the 4th I received a cablegram from Captain Timewell saying that Sheppard was out of danger. A similar thing happened yesterday as you see by the enclosed messages. Will you kindly investigate the case & let me know whether No 1420 Ice-bpl Sheppard is really dangerously ill or not. I do not wish to cause you inconvenience but the members of Sheppard's family are much distressed at the conflicting news.
