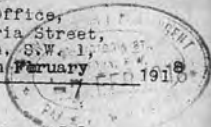



The firing party consisted of 23 Other Ranks and one Bugler of the Guards Machine Gun Regt. The service was conducted by the Rev. Capt. D. W. Hall, C.F., C.of E. A volley of three rounds blank was fired at 1.05 P.M., and the last post sounded at 1.10 P.M. Corporal Short was buried in Grave No. 183631, Newfoundland Plot.

A wreath from the Newfoundland War Contingent Association was laid upon the coffin, which was covered by the Union Jack.

Amongst those who attended at the grave-side was Sergeant W. Hutchings, representing the P.A.R.C.

A volley of three rounds blank was fired at 1.05 P.M., and the last post sounded at 1.10 P.M. Corporal Short was buried in Grave No. 18531, Newfoundland Plot.

A wreath from the Newfoundland War Contingent Association was laid upon the coffin, which was covered by the Union Jack.

Amongst those who attended at the grave-side was Sergeant W. Hutchings, representing the P.&R.O.
