As you are aware your late husband Frederick Smallwood who died on September 9th. last did not leave a will. Administration of his estate must consequently be taken out and I am applying to the Supreme Court for a grant of Letters to you. The application will be acceded to as a matter of course. The estate consists roughly of certain Real Estate and your late husband's business as a Boot and Shoe Manufacturer and Retailer.
