Dear Sir:-

#5307, Isaac Smith, of Bishop's Cove, C.B. reported back to Depot few days ago after a lengthy absence from the Regiment. This man enlisted on 22nd May, 1918 and was granted Home Leave for 8 days from May 26th. Four days after he arrived home he was taken ill and he states that you were called to attend him about the 1st day of his illness. I have a certificate from you dated June 21st to the effect that Pte Smith had been suffering from Broncho-Pneumonia and at that time was not fully recovered. You also state in your certificate that Smith suffered from Tuberculosis and spat blood on many occasions during the ^{previous} past 12 months. Pte. Smith states that you continued professional attendance upon him until some time in July.

We have never received any further certificate from you concerning this man's condition. Will you please let me have your opinion as to this man's condition in July and at what time you think he might have been able to report. His pay has been accumulating during his absence and if he had been doing nothing and remained away deliberately, of course he is not entitled to it. Please let me have reply soon as possible as he is now ready for discharge.

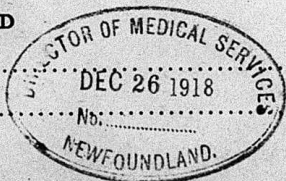
