EXTRACT S/C ORDER, NO.152/15.

1508---DISCHARGE: CERTIFICATES.

It is notified for information that cases are daily brought to notice where certificates given to Soldiers on discharge are either incorrectly made out, or the wrong certificates are issued. The attention of all Officers commanding Units is therefore directed to the instructions contained in paragraphs 415 to 422, King's Regulations.

In many instances it has been found that the character awarded recruits discharged under class (i) or (iii), (a) (b) or (c) of paragraph 392, King's Regulations, has not been recorded on Army Form B.2079, as laid down in paragraph 415 (i), King's Regulations; cases have also come to notice in which men with six month's service and over have not been given Character Certificate (and cover), Army Forms B.2067 and B.2067A, in accordance with paragraph 415 (iii) King's Regulations. During the period of embodiment, men discharged from the Territorial Force with six month's service and over should receive Army Forms B.2067 and B.2067A in addition to Army Form E.511.

In many cases it has also been found that Commanding Officers have recorded a man's Military character, "Good," "Fair," etc. on Army Form B.2067, instead of entering thereon a certificate so worded that employers of labour can readily estimate his true worth and qualifications for civil employment. Special attention is therefore invited to Paragraph 418, King's Regulations.

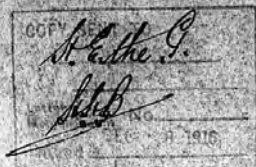

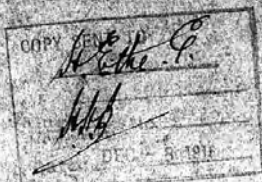
