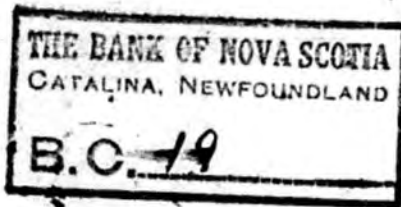

Now should the worst happen I shall trust to you to look after his burial as if he were your own brother. I shall have little or no instructions to give. I would like if possible for him to be borne to his last resting place by his own soldier fellow country man. You will

see that he has a respectable coffin or casket but not too elaborate or expensive.

In a letter from Sir Edward Morris he says that he has seen John and he is in no pain and is quite happy and contented and is well looked after and cared for. Now this gives us much consolation not that we had any fear that it would be otherwise but coming from him settles all doubt in our minds.

With reference to your 11390/84/P.&A., concerning the above mentioned soldier, in which you ask for information and ruling, I have the honour to inform you that the matter was referred to the Pensions and Disabilities Board. I am enclosing herewith copy of their reply, which speaks for itself.

The Pensions and Disabilities Board now doing duty, is the old organisation under the Patriotic Association. The Pensions Commissioners specified in the Pensions Act are not yet appointed; it is impossible to say until these Commissioners are appointed, whether the present procedure will be continued eventually. The present Board state that they are not anxious, and further, would not consider it advisable to make any ruling as regards procedure, which might not meet with the views of the Commissioners.

The fact is appreciated that the system adopted by the Canadian forces, and by the Imperial forces differ to a large extent, but this cannot be remedied, until such time as the Government make the necessary appointments provided for under the Pensions Act.

I am in receipt of your letter of Nov. 27th, regarding the above named soldier, and, in reply, I beg to state that this man is still on the strength of the Regiment; his case is not one to be dealt with by the Pensions and Disabilities Board. If he has <sup>d 3 m</sup> been discharged, the procedure would be to make him an allowance of \$40.00 per month during his stay at the sanitarium, and to pay for the cost of his upkeep. In view of the fact that he has not been discharged, the usual procedure would apply; namely: he would be entitled to his full pay, less his allotment of 50¢ per day, and the cost of his upkeep will be a charge on Public Funds.

With reference to your letter 8/12/17 (136) relative to the above named Soldier: It would appear that this office No. 11390/87, 29/10/17 was referred to the Pensions & Disabilities Board under a misapprehension.

The question under review was not of granting a Pension entirely but one affecting a general procedure in dealing with Soldiers undergoing Sanatorium treatment, namely, whether,-

- (1) They should be retained on the strength of the Contingent and continue to receive pay as if they were still effective Soldiers, or
- (2) Discharged, when so recommended by a Medical Board?

Your definite rulings as to this point will simplify any other instances that may occur and avoid uncertainty in dealing with such cases. Meanwhile it is understood to be your wish in this particular case the procedure in (1) will be followed.

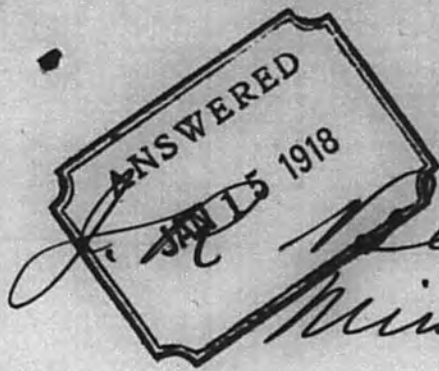

I am in receipt of your letter of November, 27th., regarding the above named soldier, and in reply, I beg to state, that as this man is still on the strength of the Regiment, his case is not one to be dealt with by the Pensions & Disabilities Board. If he had been discharged, the procedure would be, to make him an allowance of \$40.00 per month during his stay at the sanatorium, and to pay for the cost of his up-keep. 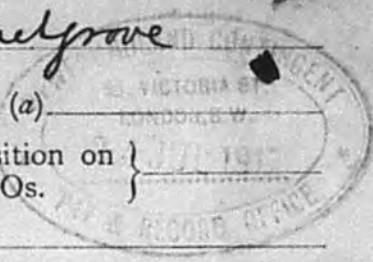
