Dear Sir Patrick:-

No. 3266, L/Cpl. Snow has spoken to me about his present position; as I see it, his case is this: He is receiving at present \$35.00 per month regimental pay, \$30.00 per month subsistence allowance and \$20.00 per month Separation Allowance, in all \$85.00 per month. If he were a pensioner, under the amended pensions allowances he would be receiving \$50.00 per month pension and \$40.00 per month on account of his five children, totaling \$90.00 per month. In addition to this, it is ^{quite} ~~not~~ competent for him to take up any civil employment that he might secure, and which would further increase his income. At present he is acting as Orderly for the Vocational Officer, for which he receives no special recompense; but if he filled this position as a returned discharged soldier, he would no doubt receive compensation for this work.

Would you be good enough to give his case your consideration to see if anything can be done for him, as he has a family of five children whom he is desirous of giving an efficient education. This Department will be quite satisfied to discharge him if your Board considers it desirable to do so.

Dear Mr. Bennett,

Yours of the 9th to hand, respecting 3266 L/c. Snow.

I have already explained to him, and to Lieut-Col.

Rendell, at whose suggestion, he says, he came to me, the position with regard to his case. He can either elect to remain on the strength of the Regiment and draw full pay and allowances as would an uninjured soldier, or he can claim his status as a pensioner, in which case we will pay him the prescribed amount according to the disability assessed upon his case by the Medical Board. But he cannot have a combination of the two positions; that is to say, he cannot continue to accept pay and allowances as a soldier on the strength, and be recognized as a claimant for any provision from the Pension Board. If he wishes to assume the status of a pensioner and the Vocational authorities desire to engage him as a civilian orderly we have no objection whatever. The only position I took with regard to him when he saw me, and took to Col. Rendell (who perfectly recognized it) was that we could not, as a Pension Board, make an exception in his case without leaving ourselves open to demands for similar concessions from every other pensioner on our list.

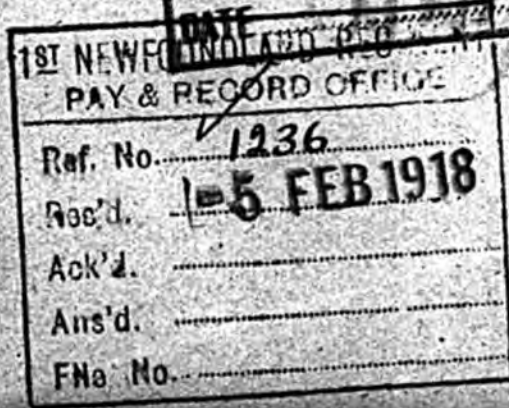
