Dear Mrs. Snow:-

On behalf of myself and the Dept. of Militia, and Officers and men of The Royal Newfoundland Regiment, I extend you our sincere sympathy on the untimely and sad death of your son, ex Corporal Fred Snow.

Since joining the ranks of the Regiment, Corpl. Snow was an exemplary young soldier, and always performed his duty with the utmost satisfaction and credit to himself. His transfer for the purpose of entering the services of the Royal Flying Corps was regretted by us all as far as the Regiment was concerned; but we felt and hoped that it would have given him a wider field to serve his King and country.

The sudden termination of his young life must, indeed, be a sad blow to yourself and his father, and all his relatives. It was certainly a matter of great grief to those who had come to know him intimately, especially in the last few months.

Whilst he did not actually give up his life fighting the foe, still his death is none the less glorious, prepared as he was to give up all in defence of the grand principles for which the Newfoundland Regiment and all other forces in His Majesty's dominions are fighting in this great and cruel war.

I trust that you and the members of your family
will have the Divine consolation in this, your sad and trying
hour.
