The history of this man's case is as follows:

Private Snow enlisted on 31st October, 1918 and on that date was granted Home Leave until November 9th and extension without pay from 9th to 19th. He returned on the 19th. Two days afterwards he applied to see me with reference to being granted Leave without pay until recall. This was at the time when similar cases were dealt with in the same manner—immediately prior to Preliminary Demobilization Orders being issued—whereby men who could show a good case were permitted to proceed on Leave without Pay until Recall, and a Conditional Release form to that effect was signed.

This man was released on these conditions for the purpose of taking up civil employment and consequently he was discharged on Demobilization without any allowances according to regulations.

This man's service amounted to two days in Barracks.

Tait. i done so and he said he could not discharge me but he would give me a temporary discharge not saying anything about any money for me thou. give me few days pay and told me to beat it she did not say anything about my 8 days board but i had to say something about it when i had to pony the money up.

my discharge says not to wear the uniform but they would not give one after the war but if i did not enlist i would probly get a uniform of white and black the note i got with my release certificate says not eligable for pay or allowance well then how old have a soldier got to be have he got to wear a full growed beard and rear white hairs if that is the age a 21 year old boy wings in for nothing when i went over to barracks i lost more thin i gained i lost \$4 dollars every day but got nithin in returns for that if i am eligable to go to war i am eligable for money enough to pay my board when ye called me away from work.
