STATEMENT OF PRISONER OF WAR

2703 Private John Snow,
Manuels.

Enlisted: May 1916. Proceeded Overseas: July 1916.

Company in France: "D".

Date and Place of capture: Monchy-le-Preux, April 14th, 1917.

CIRCUMSTANCES OF CAPTURE: When we got up to the top of the hill in front, as far as I could see, there were only 7 of us left in "D" Coy., and we were scattered about in shell-holes immediately on the right of the Essex. When the Essex gave way and surrendered, they were completely surrounded and we found ourselves in the midst of the Germans, too, and were taken prisoners. All our ammunition was gone and there was no other course to take.

DETAILS OF LIFE AND TREATMENT: We were sent to Douai and then to Fort MacDonald in Lille for about 5 days. Then I went to Marquion behind the German lines, for about a month and a half, where we had to work under our own shell-fire road-making, unloading trucks etc. We were badly treated here as it was a kind of Reprisal Camp and we were given practically no food to eat, but only watery soup once a day and $\frac{3}{4}$ lb. black bread at night. We had no blankets or greatcoats and the nights were very cold. Then we were shifted to Bouchesnes for about 3 months doing various kinds of work. Our treatment here was a little better. We were given a blanket each and if we complained of being sick we were nor always driven out to work. I was not well here and was sent to a Convalescent Camp at Wez, near Tournai for about 3 months. My next move was to Heilsberg in Germany. This was a distributing centre for working parties in the country round about and we were sent out to a farm called ~~the~~ Kleine Goul, near Gardanen. We were here about 11 months, right up to the Armistice. We were kept working all day long at heavy work, and depended upon the German farmers for our food, which consisted of barley and potatoes. In most cases they were fairly good to us. I got my first parcels from the Red Cross in June 1918 and the first letter from home reached me in March 1918.

After the Armistice we were repatriated to England via Danzig, Copenhagen and Leith, and arrived at Rijen on Dec. 8th.

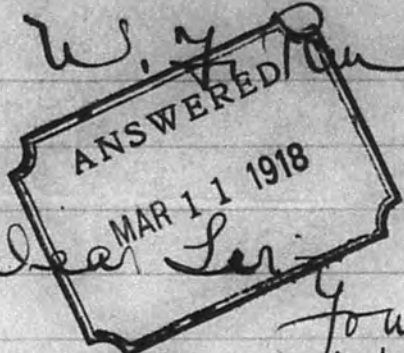

So far a direct notification from you has not been received, as in the case of other Prisoners of War, and which usually includes a request for clothing, with particulars of sizes, etc., especially as to boots: meanwhile with a view to avoiding what may entail considerable delay in your receiving supplies, this Office is drawing and transmitting to you through the Central Prisoners of War Committee, a first issue of clothing, based upon sizes implied by information stated in your attestation.

Any change of your address should be notified to this Office, which in turn will be transmitted to Newfoundland, and to the Newfoundland War Contingent Association.
