Snow, who died of shell wounds multiple at the First London General Hospital, Etaples, on April 19th, are anxious to receive some more definite information regarding their boys sufferings before his death; that is to say, what was the nature of his wounds, whether he regained consciousness and in fact any other particulars which they would naturally be desirous of knowing.

I thought that you might possibly be able to obtain a detailed report as to his case from the hospital authorities and I shall be glad therefore if you will communicate with them with that end in view and furnish me with any details which you may be able to obtain.

Dear Sir,

In reply to your letter of the 14th instant, I beg to say that the Authorities at the Newfoundland Pay and Record Office, London, have standing instructions from the Government to obtain and communicate, as soon as possible, all information which the next of kin of a deceased soldier would desire to have. Such information would relate to the time and place of burial, including, if possible, a photograph of the grave. The effects, when collected, are transmitted to the Record Office, London, and by them sent to Newfoundland, after which they are distributed by the Deputy Paymaster here to the next of kin.

You will appreciate that, under existing circumstances, some time must necessarily elapse before this information can be obtainable, but you may rest assured that the matter is constantly receiving the attention of the Regimental Authorities in London.
