I have questioned Snow and obtained the following information. His father sailed as a seaman, in a vessel from Burin to West Indies, and was taken with fever and sent to New York for treatment. He has been there over a month. Says he is the only son, and his mother and four children depending on him until his father recovers. One other sister is earning for herself.

Will you please advise me what to do with this man? If thought desirable, he could become subject to Separation Allowance under Regulation 4D, until such time as his health becomes fit for work again



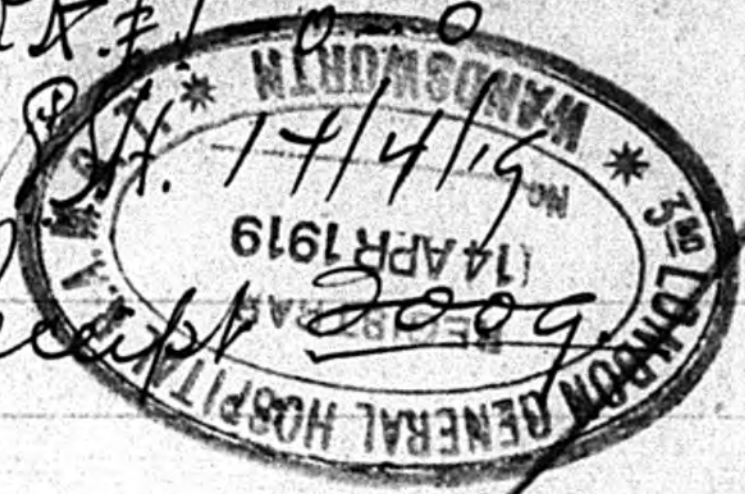

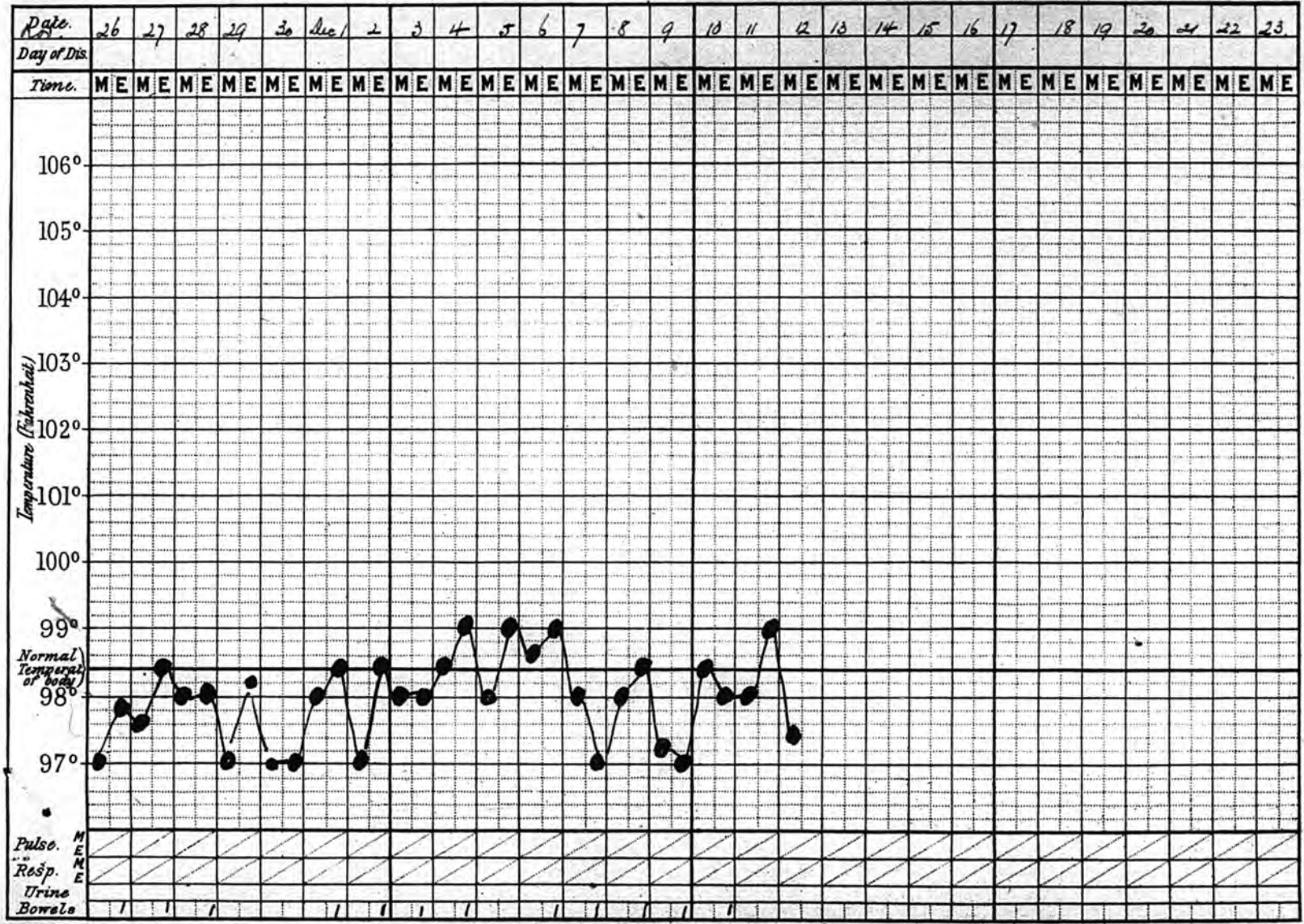
