Dear Sir,

It was with the greatest regret that the Government received a message from the Record Office, London, to the effect that your son No. 243, Private Josiah Squibb, was killed in action on the 19th October last.

On behalf of the Government I beg to tender you their sincerest sympathy with you and your family at this time. It is a time of sadness and yet through it all there is the cheering thought that your noble boy obeyed the call of King and Country and nobly died facing the foe in defence of the principles of Righteousness, Truth and Justice. There was no holding back so far as your son was concerned, for he was amongst the first who volunteered and we are proud to have such gallant young men, as well as such patriotic fathers and mothers, who so willingly give them up upon the call of Duty. Your boy's name will be inscribed upon the Roll of Honour and will be held in fragrant memory by all his countrymen. He did his best and gave his utmost for the cause of Liberty and, because of his life and death, the time has been brought nearer when Peace and Truth shall reign again upon the earth. In your sorrow you can look up and realize that he at least has reached the victor's crown of glory.

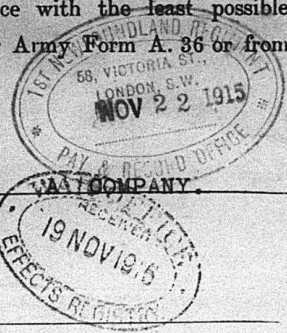

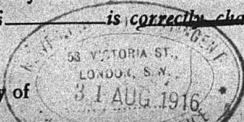
