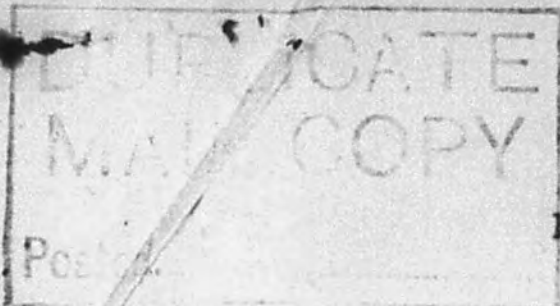

Instructions were given to this office that all allotments of deceased men, payable to other than father or mother, were to be discontinued, as it was considered that in cases where the allotment was payable to brother or sister, if such were dependents they would write in and inform us of the circumstances.

I would advise that if Mrs. Squires is a dependent on her late son, that she communicate with the Pension Commissioners here, and they will fully consider her claim for pension.
