**Military Medal**

*London Gazette, March 19th 1918*

*Action Date, November 20th 1917 - Cambrai*

For conspicuous gallantry on and after November 20th. Repeatedly by day and night he carried wounded to the Aid Post and thence into Marcoing under very heavy shell fire. While in the town he sought out on his own initiative the Battalion rations which had been scattered by shell fire, and carried food and water forward to the front line by daylight through heavy shell and machine gun fire. His repeated journeys to the Aid Post with water considerably improved the chances of many wounded men. His work was a fine example to all ranks.
