Notes.—(i.) I am directed by the High Commissioner to state for your information that an application has been made at these offices by Mr. James Starks formerly No. 1121 of the Royal Newfoundland Regiment, for particulars as to what provision, if any, is made by the Newfoundland Government for courses of technical training which are open to discharged and disabled soldiers.

It appears that this man has had three years' service in France, has been twice wounded and was returned to St. John's and discharged there and is now receiving a pension of \$20 per month. He claims that assistance is given to discharged and disabled soldiers by the Newfoundland Government up to \$50 per month over and above the actual training fees, to those wishing to undergo courses of technical training.

The special course required in this case is available at the Technical Institute at Wimbledon, but it is essential to know, before a definite application is made on his behalf, that the Newfoundland Government will be prepared to assist him to some extent in a financial way.

In order to be able to advise this man as to his position, the High Commissioner would be obliged by your informing him as to what are the instructions of the Newfoundland Government covering such cases.
