OPINION OF THE MEDICAL BOARD.

NOTES.—(i) Clear and definite answers are to be filled in by the Board, as, in the event of a man being invalided, it is essential that the Minister of Pensions should be in possession of the most reliable information to enable him to decide upon the man's claim to pension.

Expressions such as "may," "might," "probably," etc., are to be avoided.

(ii.) The rates of pension vary according to whether the disability is (a) caused or aggravated by service in the present war. (b) Due to causes not connected with the present war, viz., (1) Previous active service. (2) Climatic diseases in pre-war service. (3) Ordinary military service before the war. 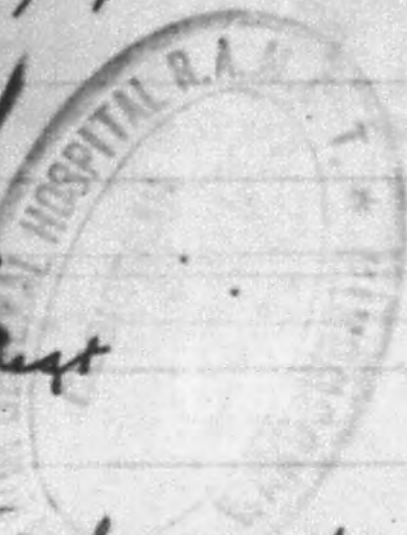

With further reference to your wire of 10th Dec. and my letter of 12th Dec., I have the honour to inform you that a cable was received 15th Dec. from Rev. W.B. Bugden, Catalina, stating that Samuel Steed was born Jan. 30th, 1900. The matter was referred to the Officer Commanding Depot Headquarters, and the reply received from him states that Samuel Steed enlisted and was attested at Grand Falls, on Dec. 5th, 1917, when he gave his age as 18 years. It has been customary to accept men for service if they were three months under 18 years, but such men have been held in St. John's or in Scotland until they were of age before being sent overseas (France).




