Descriptive Return of a Soldier Discharged on Account of Disability

Dear Mr. Steele:

I am in receipt of your letter.

I am unable to give you any information whatever as to details in connection with the matter of pensions. That is not a Government matter. The Pension Board was created by statute, and the Government provides them with certain annual funds out of the revenue of the Colony, but with the expenditure of the funds the Government has nothing to do. No order of the Government or interference by myself or any member of the Government can in any way affect the consideration of any application. So as to make it impossible for there to be any Government interference in connection with pension matters an Act of the Legislature was passed some years ago under which this Board was created as a statutory board having statutory authority and not having any association with the Government.

The best I can do is to forward your letter to the Secretary of the Board asking him to look into the case and report.
