Dear Bright.

With reference to your letter of 27th March, concerning your brother #2930, Opl. Conrad Stein. I telegraphed to the Record Office to find out if he was married and if his Commanding Officer had given him permission to marry. The Record Office reports that the Officer Commanding the 2nd Battalion states that your brother is not married and has not requested permission. The date of the reply is April 10th.

I have read through your brother's letter to you and am at a loss to understand his request for £40, particularly in view of the fact that you had sent him at least £50 within the period of less than four months, from end of October, to the 1st February. As full Corporal he draws \$1.20 per day or roughly \$36 per month and he has no expenses for lodging, food, light or fuel, nor for clothing. It is not for me to offer any advice in a matter between you and your brother, but certainly if I were in your place, I should require to know more particulars as to what use the money will be put to before forwarding such an amount as £40. His position financially ought to be quite alright and you as a married man have greater call elsewhere.

With reference to his remarks about getting your consent, I can only say that the only permission necessary in



Dear Walter:-

I am sending you this letter re a personal matter concerning my Brother, #2950 Corporal Conrad Stein, which I am thinking might stand some looking into by the Military Authorities. I am enclosing herewith telegrams numbered 1 - 5 and the last letter that I received from my Brother. I might state that I have only received four letters from him since he went over to the other side. He is a poor correspondent. Now if you will read his enclosed letter you will notice on the last two pages that he says that he has got mixed up with the Females and of course has to get married. Now that is his own funeral and he has to make the best of it. But now look at the Telegrams. Telegrams 1 - 4 I have complied with and sent the money as requested, but Telegram 5 is what puzzles me. He knows that I have sent him all the available funds and yet he asks me for an amount which takes me three months to earn. He says in his letter that he was twenty years old in December past, but that is not right. He was born Dec. 30th, 1899 and so will be only nineteen Dec. coming. You will notice that he mentions something about getting my consent. I do not know what he means by that. It seems to me that some person or persons have got him in their power and are "doing" him. You have here-

with all the available information that I have got and if you think the matter worth an enquiry through your department it would be doing me a personal favour which I would greatly appreciate. Shoud you not be able to do anything in the matter return enclosures and let me know,

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of 10th December, concerning the above mentioned soldier. A cable has been received this day as follows:

"2930 Stein temporarily unfit
"for general service owing to
"bruised foot.
Commanding Nfld. Ayr."

It is regretted that my letter of 22nd November was not quite clear. The War Office Regulations say that men from Overseas Dominions are considered to be on active service from date of embarkation from their own country. The term Expeditionary Force is applied to all men from the Dominions for service, because it is intended that eventually they will be sent to some theatre of war. They are known as Expeditionary Force men, when they have been in some theatre of war, hence my use of the term.

To revise my letter of 22 November I would state that the next of Kin is notified in case of casualties being reported of men serving with the first Battalion in France, and in case of serious illness of men in training at the Depot, Scotland, I regret that my former letter was not quite clear. The matter of advising the next of Kin
