This is all that I can say upon the case. His triglycerides indicated that he was in a slightly nervous state.

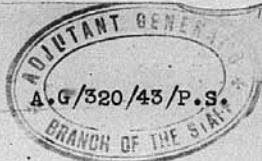





Correspondence re Charge by Lt Col Hadwin

Ref. Para 3 of Minute 21.

(a) Instructions for the attack were given verbally to Company Commanders by Lt Col. A. S. Haden in person. Capt. Stick was commanding A Coy and was present at all the conferences, which I also attended.

Capt. Stick's orders were as follows:-
At zero hour - 6.20 am on Nov. 20th - Companies were to move in fours, with distances of 100 yds between Coys, in the following order ~~A, B, C~~, A, D, B, C, from the assembly area near GOUZEAU-COURT to the forming up position in the original British front line.

When this position was reached, A Coy on the right & D Coy on the left were to occupy the front line trenches, & with B & C Coys in the support trenches respectively.

A bugle would sound the advance, at which time Coys. would leave the trenches and advance in artillery formation - diamond shaped - with A Coy in front, D Coy on the left, B Coy on the right, & C Coy in rear.

Batt. Hqs. with B Coy, when opposition was met with at

the first objective, Coys were to shake on into attack formation and continue to advance.

There were three objectives for the attack called the BLUE BROWN, & RED LINES respectively and the objective of this Battalion was part of the RED LINE - the final objective which lay beyond the CANAL and N. of the village of MARNIERES. Capt. Stick was instructed to lead his Coy. through the 1st & 2nd objective and capture that part of the RED LINE allotted to Battalion, in conjunction with the other Coys.; and to consolidate and hold the position.

(b) GOUZEAU-COURT, Edition 2 Special Sheet 1/20,000.

(1) Assembly area at zero hour - 6.20 am. Q. 29 c.

(2) Forming up position R. 14 b.
The bugle sounded at 10:15 am. on Nov. 20th and the Coys. left the jumping off trenches on time. I saw Capt. Stick then present.

(d) The unit remained in the line
from Nov. 20 ^{to} till relieved on night

It was not known definitely before
the attack how long the Battalion would
be in the line, but Capt. Strick was
warned that it would be for four
or five days at least.

Statement of my actions on Nov 20
1917 as well as I can remember

On November 20th I was Commanding
A Company 1st Newfoundland Regiment.
My orders were to pass through the
1st and 2nd objective which had been
taken by another Division and
capture part of the 3rd objective
known as the Red Line across the
Canal.

On leaving the jumping off trench
which was the original British front line
the Battalion moved in Diamond artillery
formation. My Company was the
leading Company of the Diamond
my Company was also in Diamond
formation and my position was with
the rear platoon of the Diamond

After crossing the 1st objective my
leading platoons came under heavy
sniping fire more especially on my
left leading platoon, from the line
of the 2nd objective which seemed to
me, not to be mopped up, at this
period the Company extended and
got in the attack formation.

My left leading platoon slowed
down. When the platoon that I was
with caught it up and all made
for the trench, killing and capturing
about 30 of the enemy.
We were only in this trench a couple
of minutes as the enemy surrendered very
quickly when I ordered the advance to
be continued.

We went forward under sniping fire about
150 yards when we came across another
trench containing a few of the enemy which
was cleared immediately, we practically
jumped in and out again. On my right
and in line with the trench was a tank
in fire which was being shelled. Should
Judge tank was about 100 yds away
On jumping out I noticed one of my

Lewis gun teams still in the trench. I asked them what they were doing there and ordered them forward at once. They informed me they were taking the Lewis gun carriers of a couple of wounded men. I saw them get out of the trench. My runner and servant were with me up to this point, and shells were falling around.

I jumped across a bit of a trench to follow them, and just as I landed on the other side a shell burst apparently under my feet. I saw a ball of flame and do not remember anything for sometime afterwards. When I recovered consciousness I was in a trench, and was told by a couple of men of the Rifle Brigade that they picked me up and brought me in. As I tried to move, my head was very dizzy and felt a severe pain in my back. I stayed there for what I should judge was half an hour. When I saw a couple of Boche carrying a stretcher with a stretcher bearer in charge of them. This S. B. helped me along

with his arm around my waist and mine around his neck, back to what looked to me like the 1st objective. Here I met a Doctor who offered me Brandy and water, I had a cup of tea and rested there for sometime. The Doctor offered to send me out on a stretcher which I refused. I left there and was helped along by a stretcher bearer to the Field Dressing Station at Villiers Buch. From there I went by ambulance to a Dressing Station somewhere near Fins and rested the night. The next day I was sent to the 44th Casualty Clearing Station.

Herewith further statements as requested.

I am personally quite satisfied that Capt. Strick's statement is correct and that this officer was knocked out by a shell.

The officer who was then commanding the Regt and who appears to have pushed the case in the 1st place, himself recommended Capt. Strick in the Meritorious August for the M.C. Immediate Reward.

I am unable to discover any reflection against this officer's courage until the incident referred to when for some time after the alleged shell shock he apparently showed signs of nerves.

This officer was in the front line at Passchendaele holding the line from Jan. 26th to Jan. 30th. After he came out I personally complimented him on his good work and coolness under machinegun fire, being at the time ignorant of the matter contained in attached correspondence.

I understand that the G.O.C 88th Bde also formed a good opinion of Capt. Strick while in the line.

The temporary display of nerves would tend to show that Capt. Strick was shell shocked, and I request that the matter may be dropped and a suitable apology be offered to Capt. Strick.
