Two warrants covering Private Stockley's passage from St. John's to his home in Cotter's Cove were given him before leaving here; one from St. John's to Twillingate and the other from Twillingate to Cotter's Cove. The warrant forwarded by you to us is the second one issued to him; that is from Twillingate to Cotter's Cove, and it has been changed by Stockley to read "from Summerford to Lewisporte. 
No doubt you will be surprised to hear from me in connection with a matter foreign to family relationship. I was speaking to Ethel a day or two ago and told them that Messrs. Harris & Keachie, Barristers of this City, have had a considerable amount of difficulty in securing a certificate from your Militia Department, stating just how much money JOHN STOCKLEY received as part of the pay due by the Government to Alfred Stockley, during his period overseas, and also to state when he left for Overseas, and when the pay stopped. I might say the reason for enquiring as to this is, that John Stockley has taken an action in one of our Courts in Toronto, against his brother Alfred, for moneys loaned to him. Alfred counter-claims that John received a sufficient amount of money from the Government of Newfoundland to off set this claim. I had a letter from the Government telling me how much they had paid, but the Judge has asked for a certificate from their Militia Department.

I wish you would please be good enough to take it up with the Department and have them send me a certificate under the signature of the head of the Militia Department, so that we will be in a position to complete this case. It was started in 1925 and has been hanging around ever since.

I trust that you are all well and that Mrs. Bartlett has arrived home safely.

Your letter of Nov.19th.1927, to Hon. George A. Bartlett, has been referred, through the Honourable, The Colonial Secretary, to me.

In reply I beg to advise that I sent you the required information regarding payments on account of Alfred Stackley, on June 22nd.1925, and I gather from your letter that this certificate is not acceptable by the Judge of one of your Courts.

Perhaps this gentleman might be willing to change his decision in this regard, when it is explained to him that the Department of Militia, Newfoundland, ceased to exist on April 1st.1924, and that the writer of this and the letter above referred to is in his official capacity, the successor of the Department.

Also, the writer, was Paymaster and Officer in charge of records at the Department of Militia at the time the payments were actually made, and such payments were made by him.

Further, no matter by whom any certificate regarding the payments may be signed, any information regarding them would have to be obtained from the writer, who is custodian of the records.

I trust that this explanation may help to clear the matter for you.
