Dear Stokes,-

Many thanks for sending the two men, who arrived this morning and will take up their duties at once. I understand they have both been used to clerical work, and I hope will prove useful in breaking down the accumulations in this Office.

I am applying at the War Office for a typewriter on loan to be sent to you. I understand you still have a Remington machine which has been on hire since 24/2/15, and the hire will soon represent its value. Could this be dispensed with, or could an offer be made to buy it right out? The former course would naturally be preferable.

With regard to discharge documents these have been, and should be sent to me. In the case of a man repatriated to Newfoundland it has been the practice for a duplicate set to be sent by you to Headquarters, St. John's, so that they reach there about the same time as the men concerned; otherwise if both originals and duplicates are sent to me missing a mail becomes more or less unavoidable, with a result that some inconvenience naturally results the other end when men arrive before the particulars relating to them. Generally speaking I follow as much as possible the practices of the British Army, and in this respect I

may

may no doubt look to you to kindly give me any tips
on aspects which I may not be conversant with.

as there is only one here and
I am afraid with the coming
expansion of the Regiment that
there will be a considerable
increase of office work. The Royal
Standard seems to be a good
machine and easy to learn on.

There is one point I am not
clear upon and that is, when a
man is discharged are all his
documents sent to you, it is
the custom to do this in the
British Service, but I don't want to
start anything different to what
has been the custom here before. It

would suit as better if they were
and of course sent in time for
you to notify the Governor, before
the arrival of the mail. You were
not snowed up on your way
back, we have escaped the snow
here so far.
