I desire to refer to your letter, reference Pensions, dated 25th November 1931, and the arrangements made between the Commonwealth Treasury and Mr. Gilbert representing the Ministry of Pensions and who acted for your Government in this matter, under which persons receiving United Kingdom pensions or similar allowances in Australia are to be paid a supplement in Australian currency to bring the payments up to the sterling equivalent, thus giving the persons the benefit of the exchange rate.

The arrangements, as you are no doubt aware, date from 1.1.30. but as the first supplement was not paid until July 1931, a number of persons entitled to supplementary payments had, in the meantime, left Australia.
