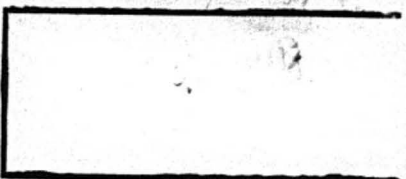

It was with the greatest regret that the Government received a message from the Record Office, London, reporting that your brave son, Private William Ambrose Stride, had died of an accidental bomb wound in the right eye on the 19th June.

We feel the loss of our loved ones and yet it is perhaps some consolation to you to know that your gallant lad gave his life in defence of the Great principles of Righteousness, Truth and Justice.
