Capt. C. S. STRONG was admitted here on 13th ult. on transfer from 76 Field Ambulance, about 2 p.m. He stated that he was wounded at 3 p.m. on 12th ult. He had a shell wound, a large fragment entering through lower angle of right scapula fracturing it and 5" x 6" x 7" ribs, and entering at midline in epigastrium - Diaphragm, liver & bile passages torn - and bile was flowing from the wound - His pulse was 160 and he had marked dyspnoea. His case was absolutely hopeless and death took place at 9.15 p.m. on date of admission.

The burial took place in 61552ENTWEX Military Cemetery, Belgium on 15th ult. I will advise you of the grave reference later - One station was then operating in Belgium.
