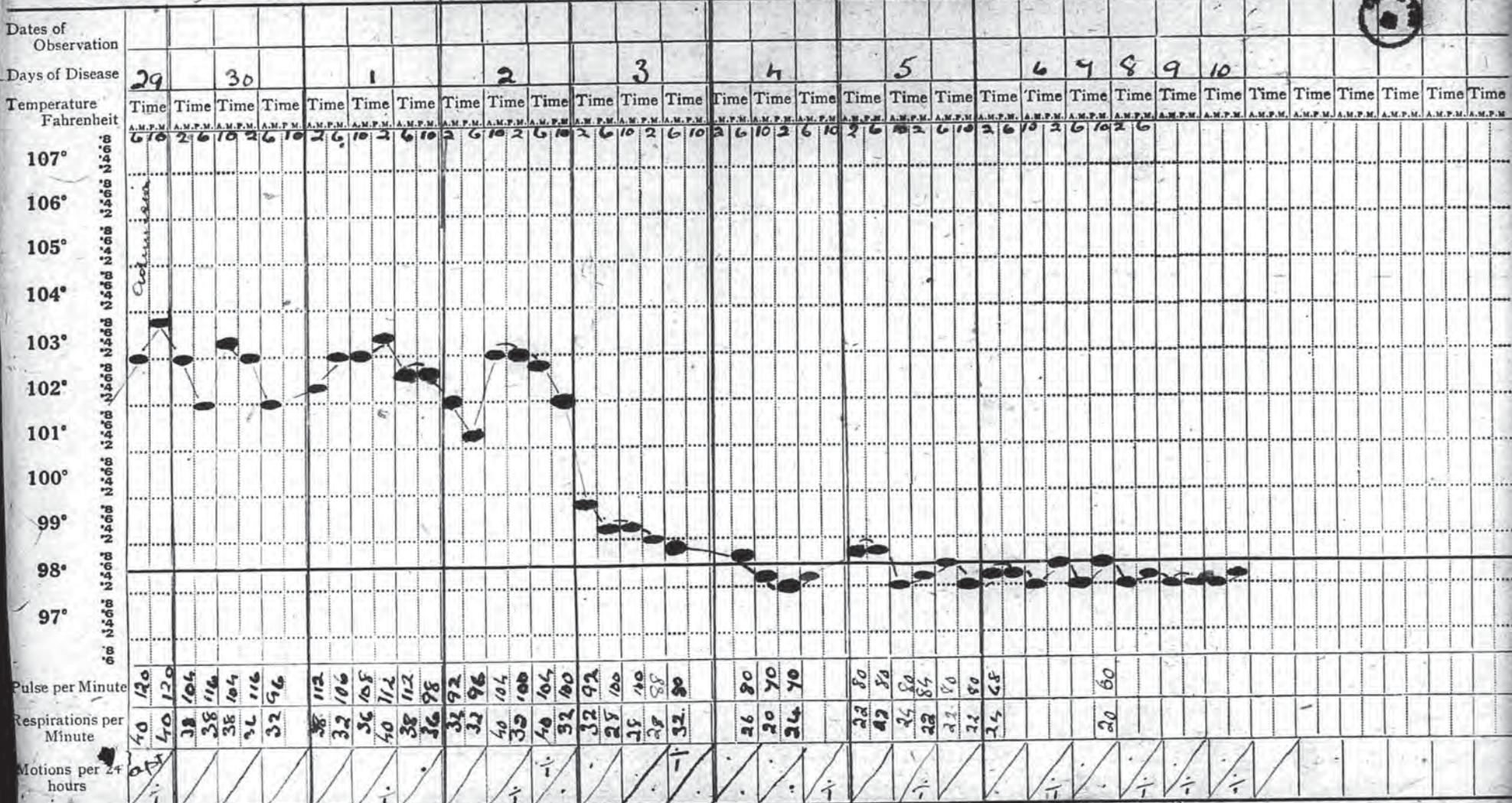

## Descriptive Return of a Soldier Discharged on Account of Disability
