The parents and friends of Private Ambrose Suley - No 3610 - 11th Regt are in a state of great distress and anxiety about him. On or about March 24, they got a telegram from you to say he was wounded, but since then they have heard nothing more. His name was never in the papers. Enquiries have been made at considerable expense to the poor people.

Please now do your best to find out at once surely he must be in the regiment or not or he must be living or dead. It seems a marvellous thing that the relatives of one of our brave defenders should be kept in this state for so long a time
