With reference to your letter of the 18th September last, relating to the Officer named above, I am directed to inform you that this Ministry confirm the assessment (5%) given by the medical board by whom the officer was examined on the 12th August last, and assesses the duration as a period of one year.

In these circumstances a renewed award has been made at the rate of \$7.25 per mensem from the 30th July, 1924, to the 29th July, 1925, the total amount for this period being \$87. The rate includes wife's and child's allowance.

It is presumed that payment of this award will be made by the Board of Pension Commissioners in the usual manner and reimbursement claimed in your next quarterly account with this Ministry.

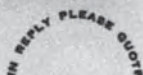

Dear Major:

Your letter of October 3rd reached me in due course, and the same has had my earnest consideration. The question of transferring men from the Regiment to the Forestry Companies is one that has given me considerable and deep concern. Your suggestion that men should be sent direct from here to the Forestry Companies is one that I am unable to agree to, because I think it would have a bad effect right through the Country. The fact of our compelling men to enlist for fighting purposes and finding that they are not required for same, and to transfer them to the Forestry, or other work, would, I fear, call forth every opposition. The plea would be put up that the men are not really required for the purpose intended by the Act. The same thing does not apply to the men at the Depot, Winchester, because the men there are trained, or partially trained for fighting, and it is only a matter of a short time, and they are on the spot, when required, to proceed to the theatre of War. However, this is the decision on this point.

A few days ago I wired to the O.C. 2nd Battalion authority to transfer 300 men, if necessary, for said purpose, provided he was satisfied to do so, and that the men would go voluntarily. From messages received since, I feel that this proposition will be a feasible one, and that you will get the necessary number to carry out your work during the coming Winter.

Major Baird arrived here yesterday, and reported to me this morning. I was glad to learn from him that you are all well, and that everything was going very satisfactorily. He is going to Norris' Arm in a day or two to see about getting the expert workmen you require. If he succeeds, these men will go forward at the earliest possible opportunity. I notice on Major Baird's order he is given a month's leave in Newfoundland, at the termination of that time we shall, no doubt, be in a better position to judge how the War is progressing, and the Demobilization of the Forestry Companies will be a question that will require immediate consideration, as well as that of the Regiment. Of course, I feel that the present operations as far as the cutting of timber at Kenmore is concerned, will likely have to be completed. However, this question must necessarily remain in abeyance at the present time, or until something definite is known.

I was glad to find from the report of the O.C. #1 District that your Corps was still keeping up the good reputation that I found they had acquired when I was over there, I feel sure that if you can get the necessary number of men you will make a record out during this season.

November 9th 1918.

With reference to tobacco. I can find no record of your writing me in this connection either before or after my visit to England. I have, however, placed an order for 1000 pounds - 500 lbs. Mayos; 250 lbs. British Colonel (dark) and 250 British Colonel (light), which will go forward, via Halifax, next week. This will reach you in time for Christmas.

With regard to fish, I am taking this matter up with Mr. Sellars, and if he will collect it, I shall see that it is forwarded by the same steamer which is taking the tobacco.

I was rather surprised to find that there was such a number of men transferring from the Forestry to the Regiment. Whilst it is a good sign to see the men with this spirit, it would appear that it is unnecessary to encourage them to do so at this time, as we have sufficient men at Winchester as well as here to meet our requirements for some time to come.

I heard from Dr. Lloyd how much he enjoyed his visit to Scotland, in fact he said that it was the best week that he spent over there. His experience was evidently similar to my own, and I shall always look back with the utmost pleasure on the short time that I spent there.

I received a most interesting letter from Mr. Beeton, a few days ago, and the several matters of importance contained therein will receive my answer in the next mail. I feel particularly gratified to know that Mr. Beeton still continues his great interest in the welfare of the men, not alone of the Forestry, but also that of the Regiment. It was most complimentary to your Corps to have Viscount Northcliffe pay you a visit and express such high praise on the work of the Forestry and such complimentary reference to our Country.

When this reached you the War will be over, or it will be a continuation of War to the bitter end - I am unable at present to say which, but I hope it will be the former.

Please give my kindest regards to Mrs. Sullivan, Vera, and Arthur. I trust they are keeping well, and this will find you and all your Officers and Men of your Corps likewise.

Nothing of importance is transpiring here at the present time. We are like yourselves having indications on Winter.

I have suggested that Major Sullivan be returned here to take charge of Forestry matters, and I would then have an opportunity of discussing this recommendation. I recognise, that all things being equal, full consideration should be given to all suggestions emanating from you, but in the case in question, I feel that possibly you personally, are not acquainted with all phases of the situation. and no harm will come of deferring the matter until I get further information.

As we are faced with a number of serious problems, in connection with the Regiment proper, I think that Major Sullivan should come here and take charge of the Forestry end of the movement. He will now know the position on your side. and will be able to place the situation before us and the public generally, better than it can be done otherwise.

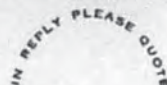



Acting on instructions received from Sir John Sterling Maxwell, Controller of Timber Supplies for Scotland, I proceeded to Newfoundland on 25th February for the purpose of procuring men to go back to Scotland to finish the logging operations, in the event of the Timber Control not being able to sell the Timber Limits, which they had purchased from private parties.

I arranged to bring over all the civilians required, but in the meantime the Timber Control for Scotland cabled me that they had been able to arrange to dispose of the Timber to local Timber Contractors. Consequently I returned to Scotland to wind up the Newfoundland Forestry Corps' business with the Timber Control Department and to arrange to send home Forestry men who were still in Scotland.

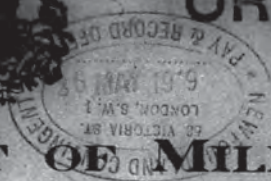
