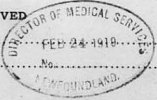

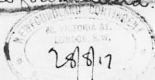



CIRCUMSTANCES OF CAPTURE: My Company was attacking Infantry Hill when I was wounded in both legs and lay out there until the Germans, after their counter attack, came to where I was, dressed my wounds and placed me in a shell-hole. The next morning they shifted me back in a rubber sheet to a village behind their lines.

DETAILS OF LIFE AND TREATMENT WHILST A PRISONER: The next day I was removed to Douai to hospital, where they attended to my wounds. I was here for three days when I was sent on to Mulheim in Germany. Here I remained for four months in Hospital. The hospital treatment itself was good and the only complaint I can make is the scarcity of food. Then I went to Dulman Camp for two weeks. The next place I went to was a farm near Berlin, in a village ~~xxxx~~ named Wrechow, in which I remained for three months. I was only able to do light duty and looked after the cows on the farm, bringing them out to graze etc. I received Red Cross parcels here and also my letters from home, and on the whole was well treated. With about ten Russians I lived in a house near the farm. We were locked in by night, but in the day time we went to work without any sentries. Then I was sent to Mannheim, a collecting station for wounded prisoners of war, and from there I was sent to Switzerland on Dec. 28th, 1917. I was in Switzerland for ten months and was then repatriated to England on Dec. 7th, 1918.

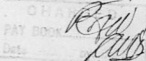
