with food also not not fit for humans, known as barley and black bread soups. The total time I spent as prisoner in Germany was about eighteen or nineteen months. During my stay on the farm I had no person who could speak English to - or any to interprit what was koing on. During my stay on the farm mentioned I had an attack of Influenza for twelve days. During my illness I was kept in a house by myself and the onlt attention I had was twice a day. An old woman would bring me a bowl of soup. At the date of my capture I was in good health and weighed 150 lbs and when I reached Newfoundland I only weighed 100 lbs with all my heavy clothes on. I do-day still find the wounds in my arm and foot. My occupation since my return home is Cod Fishing and when I get wet and cold the wounds swell and am not able to do my work as my other ship mates on that account. When I got my demobilization discharge March 19th 1919. I was discharged as medically unfit for General Service. I received a pension of \$25.00 per month for three months only. Since may last I have not received any further amount. Although I have not received any amount in lieu of a pension since May last, in my opinion I am just as much in need of it as at first, as I before stated I cannot take my place with my ship mates to do as much work as they do. And I trust that this matter will be enquired into and I will be fairly treated.


