Your letter addressed to Major Party Depot Headquarters, St. John's, has been passed to me for necessary procedure.

With reference to your enquiry, I beg to inform you that on March 23rd last a report was received by this Department stating that No. 4113, Private John Teehan was admitted to Alexander Hospital, Cosham on March 20th having been removed from the 2nd Battalion, suffering from mental trouble. This report was notified to Mr. Timothy Teehan 2 Murphy Square, this being the name which had been entered on our Roll Book as the next of kin of this soldier. A subsequent message received was to the effect that Private Teehan had been transferred from Alexander Hospital to Hapsbury War Hospital suffering from mental debility on April 6th; this information was also notified to Timothy Teehan,

We are forwarding communication to the Military authorities in the United Kingdom regarding this man's present whereabouts and condition; and when these particulars have been received by us, we will at once forward same to you.
