I met the chap by accident and although he could not manage to talk English very well he got me to understand that he had no friends at Grand Bank and was practically on the street and with no clothing. I thought I may be able to do something for him so I gave him a chance to come to Pushtrough with me and in company with me. After getting him to my home I found him to be an extremely nice boy, having a splendid disposition and good manners, but his education was very limited. My intention was to place him at my mill and try to work him ahead so that he could fill a very good position there, but I found he was not very good a manual laborer. I suppose the boys over there have not the same kind of work to do as our boys and he found it difficult to adapt himself to the work around my home.

After his death the settlement of his estate was taken up with the War Office and the Department of Justice here. It was ordered that the estate should be settled through the agency of the British Consul, Oporto. This was eventually done, and a letter from this Department to His Majesty's British Consul, Oporto, forwarding a draft to settle the estate, was mailed on the 17th of April, 1920. The next of kin given by this soldier on his enlistment was his sister, Ignas Teixeira, 5759 Rua da Fabrica, Oporto, Portugal.

I have enquired of Lt.-Col. Hangle regarding the location of this soldier's gravesite, and he informed me that as yet his grave has not been located.
