

In the draft in which this man arrived were several mumps and measles cases. The draft was immediately isolated on arriving here, and inspected every day by the M.O. He was seen to have developed measles on the 26-4-18 and was immediately sent to Hazelton Down Hospital which is a few hundred yards away from Camp. There he was getting on very well till the 6<sup>th</sup> day, when having developed Bronchial pneumonia his heart failed and refused to respond to Stimulants — He was well looked after by Capt. Lawson, R.C.M.C., who is now in Canada, and everything was done for him that could be done.


