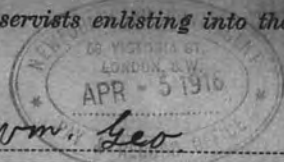

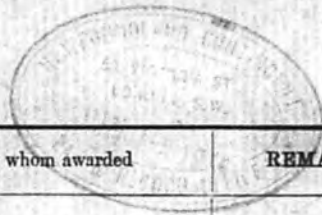

He was struck by a high explosive shell when in a dug-out. He was taken straight to Alexandria where he was treated for 1 month. Was then carried to Mudros & put on board the Mauritania & brought to England. He was operated upon in Alexandria & foreign bodies removed from the wound. He has had one operation at the 3rd London General Hospital — skin grafting.

The wound in the Right Thigh is completely healed, but has produced limitation of the movement of the hip-joint. On this account he cannot bend forwards to pick up anything he may have dropped.

The wound in the Left ankle is also healed. There is complete fixation of the ankle-joint, resulting from it. He cannot therefore walk without the aid of a stick, but with the help of it he has been able to walk a mile at the most.

Opinion of the Medical Board.

Notes.—(i.) Clear and decisive answers to the following questions are to be carefully filled in by the Board, as, in the event of the man being invalided, it is essential that the Commissioners of Chelsea Hospital should be in possession of the most reliable information to enable them to decide upon the man's claim to pension.

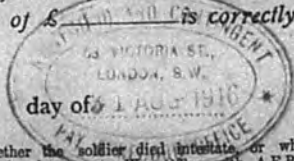

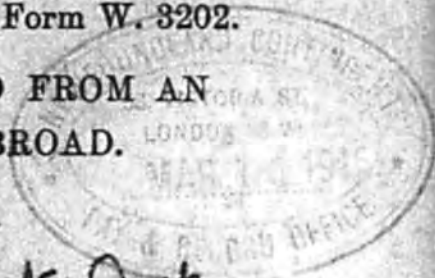

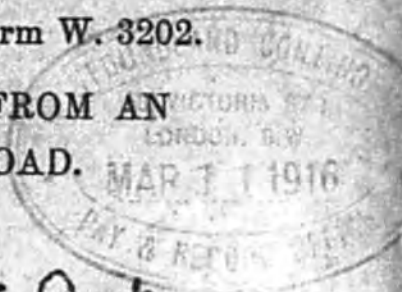
