Dear Madam:

Your letter of the 8th inst. to the Colonial Secretary, asking for information regarding monies due you on account of your late son, Pte. Lawrence Tilley, who was killed on October 9th, 1917.

Upon making inquiries I find that you have received monthly, the amount of Allotment made you by your son, and I am directed to advise you that no other payments are due on his account. It is not correct that a soldier's pay, in the Royal Newfoundland Regiment, carries on after his death. It is only in the case where a soldier, at the time of his death, has an Allotment or Separation Allowance payable to a dependent, that the payments of said Allotment and Allowance are continued until the Pension is adjusted.

As to any money that might be lying to the credit of your son, in the Pay & Record Office, London, I would say that we have not yet received his account from the other side; although it is due to arrive in any mail now. When we do receive it, you will be notified, and upon receipt of Letters of Administration from the Minister of Justice, the entire estate of your son will be handed over to you.

The last that was seen of No. 1404 Pte. Tilley, was in a shell hole between the first and second objectives, he was hit through the neck, but not yet dead, although in a very bad state. He was seen by Sgt. PURCELL R. (916) of 1st. R. Nfld. Rgt.

Ref. "Ring and Watch".

The most important articles are taken off a dead man first, in this case his A.B. 64. The man who recovered the A.B. 64. was evidently not the first to find the deceased body, or probably the Ring and Watch would have been recovered also.

I cannot find out who recovered the A.B. 64.

An enquiry has been received in this Branch from Officer In Charge, Newfoundland Records, concerning the personal effects of the above mentioned. (See copy or extract at foot hereof).

In order that a satisfactory reply may be made to the enquirey will you kindly cause the fullest investigations to be made in the matter and submit a report comprising information on the following points:-

- (1) It will be observed that a RING and WATCH are particularly desired. Was Pte. Tilley known to be in possession of the articles in question prior to his death?
- (2) The only article received here on account of Pte Tilley was an A.B.64. from the Battalion under your Command, under Memo. dated 13-10-17. If this was all that could be recovered on account of the deceased, can any reason be given?
- (3) Whether or not any personal effects were recovered from his pack?
