I beg to quote hereunder the details of the deed for which the Military Medal was awarded your late son, #3156, Pte. Heber Trask, Royal Newfoundland Regt., taken from supplement to the London Gazette.

"For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. On the morning of the 14th October 1918 during the advance from LEDEGHEM towards the LYS, almost before the barrage lifted, these two men dashed forward at a pill box. A few of the enemy were leaving the pill box, and as soon as they saw Ptes. Trask and O'Brien threw bombs at them, but these two men rushed in and bayoneted three of the enemy. They then went to the pill box and threw a bomb into it, then entered it, and captured an Officer and 35 men and 2 M.Gs. It was entirely due to the prompt action and dash of these two men that the enemy were prevented from bringing their M.Gs. into action and causing heavy casualties."

Please accept my congratulations and assurance of the appreciation of the splendid conduct of your son.

Dear Sir:

I am directed to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 25th inst., with reference to your son, 3156 Cpl. Heber Trask, who was officially reported as Missing on October 25th 1918.

I am to state that the only official message we have in connection with your son is that he was posted as Missing on the above date, and we know nothing of his being Killed or the manner of his death as has been reported to you by some of the returned soldiers. However, we are telegraphing the authorities on the other side, requesting them to make full enquiry in this connection, and to forward us all particulars available.

As to his decoration (the Military Medal) I may say that we have not yet received same from the other side, but when we do it will be immediately forwarded to you.

As to his Regimental Pay or any monies lying to his credit, I would point out that it is the rule of the Pay & Record Office, London to hold a man's estate for six months after the date of his being posted Missing or Killed. The estate is then forwarded to this Department and placed in the hands of the Minister of Justice, who grants Letters of Administration to the next of kin. As the period of six months has about expired in your son's case, his Estate should be received in the near future, when it will be handed to the Minister of Justice, and you will receive Letters of Administration for same.
