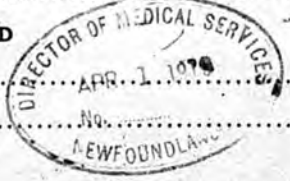

at about 10 pm. on the night  
of Sunday, 13<sup>th</sup> 1918. I was with  
Lt. Capt. S. Sheffington. We  
were returning from Wizerne  
and were riding through Zadansques  
near the Brasserie. We saw  
the lights of a motor lorry coming  
and Sheffington called to me  
"Keep in to your right, Ralph."  
I was in front. I pulled in  
to the ditch on right side of road  
& the car passed just brushing my  
left leg. I heard ~~the~~  
Sheffington groan and say "I  
believe my leg is off." I went  
to him & found him hanging on  
to the saddle with one leg. The  
left leg which was hit being held  
down straight and almost useless.  
The car was being driven very fast  
and was on the wrong side of the  
road. There was plenty of room  
for them to have kept over to their own  
side.

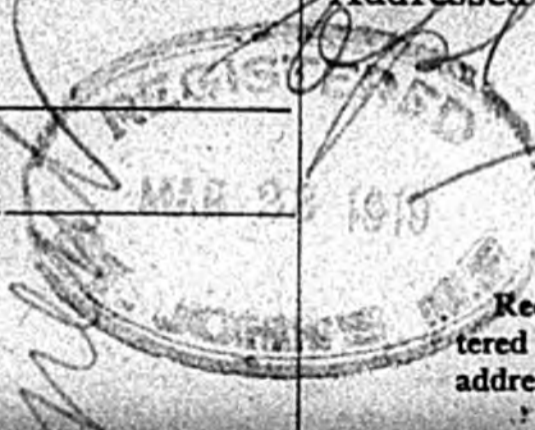

We are connected to the telegraph office - which is only one mile distant - by telephons, so the boy could be at the station at one hours notice. Anxiously awaiting

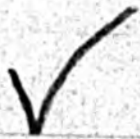
