

Dear Sir Walter,

Following my conversation  
of this morning with you re Special  
Frank Turner (No. 2653). The facts with  
regard to his case are as follows:

He was admitted to Lunenburg from  
the front early in December suffering  
from debility - principally heart - and  
after passing through V.A.D. Hospital  
was sent back to Dept early in March.

When he left Lunenburg the D. prohibited  
him from eating certain foods as it was  
necessary for him to have special  
diet. The M.O. at Dept, he writes, tell him  
the same thing.

Being in barracks he is of course



rationed the same as the others and does not wish or expect any different treatment in that respect but his present position is he practically has to fend for his own food - His brother writes also that this is really the state of the case -

Under the circumstances as above set out and if he is unfit for further active service I am fully convinced that his Father would be more than pleased if his transfer here could be effected
