DEATH CERTIFICATE

NO. 6 1918.

Duelmen, 10th, January 1918.

The hospital for prisoners of war in Duelmen has notified us that the English prisoner of war, Herbert Twiner, non-commissioned officer in the Newfoundland Regiment, Company A, Engineer. Age 20 years. Methodist religion. Resident in Bishopstols in England. Born at Sevenoaks Vale, County Kent. Single man. Son of Herbert Twiner, Farmer and his wife, Tilly (Nee Aildebaide) residing in Bishopstols, died at Duelmen in the hospital for the prisoners of war on the 7th day of January 1918 at 11.15 from the effects of a wound in the back.

Nineteen printed words in this certificate having been stricken out.

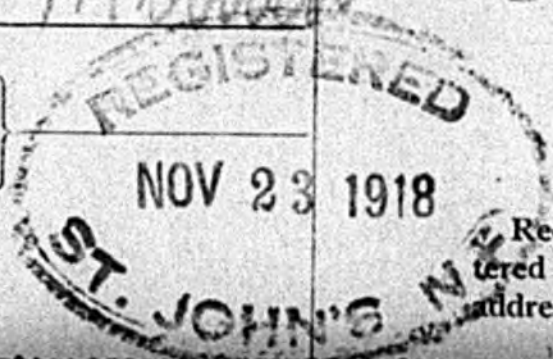

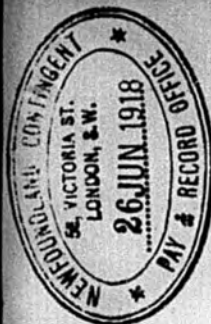


