STATEMENT OF PRISONER OF WAR.

Private Abram Jergs, Winterton, T.B.

Enlisted: Oct. 22nd, 1915. Proceeded Overseas: December 1915.

Company in France: "D" Company.

Date and Place of Capture: Monchy-le-Preux, April 14th, 1917.

CIRCUMSTANCES OF CAPTURE: In the big German counter-attack we were completely surrounded. There were 14 of us in a shell-hole and all but 3 of us were killed by a shell. We had no ammunition left and so were prisoners, as we could not get back.

DETAILS OF LIFE AND TREATMENT UNDER CAPTURE: We were sent to Fort Meudon, Lille, after spending a couple of days in Douai. Then we were working parties at Marquion, just behind the German lines, where we had to work at building light railways. We had a pretty bad time as our billet was filthy dirty and we had no means of keeping ourselves warm. Food was very scarce and what we had was bad. After a while I was sent to Douai Hospital for 5 days with swollen feet and then to Tournai Hospital for 3 weeks. Then I was sent to Germany for two weeks - still in Hospital - and here I was released. I was / few 3 days and after work one day I was picked up on the street unable to carry on further through weakness. I was sent to hospital again on Aug. 2nd and remained there till December 1917. I received no parcels at all while I was here, and I was told that the Germans were keeping all the parcels that came to the Camp for themselves.

When I came out of Hospital I was sent out to work on a railway at Nohra for a month and a half. Then I was shifted to Sondershausen, where I had to do various kinds of work and was kept here till the Armistice was signed. The treatment here was very good and they did all possible for us. We were repatriated to England via Holland and arrived in London about March 1919.
