Dear Mrs Moulton;

I have the honour to acknowledge receipt of your letter of 15, Feby., concerning 3270. Pte. A. F. Wagg. I would say that when a soldier is reported missing a description of him is sent to the Geneva Red Cross who make every endeavor to trace him by enquiring through the agents at the different Prisoners of War camps in Germany as well as the Military Hospitals in Germany.

While I do not wish to raise your hopes without justification I might say that news has just come to hand within the last week of a soldier Pte. P. Oliver, who had not been reported as a prisoner of war in Germany, this would lead one to think that there is still a chance of others turning up and this may be the case of your brother, and with others. Everything possible is done to trace men who are reported missing and if any further information comes to hand you will be notified at once.

Dear Madam:-

Your letter addressed to the Casualty Officer of July 18th with reference to the enquiry of this Department for information concerning certain members of the Regiment, of whom No. 3270 Private Albert Wagg is one, has been duly received.

I might say that I sent in this enquiry to endeavour to find out some further particulars about the nature of death of the soldiers referred to. You will note that my telegram of April 5th, 1918 states that certain information was procured through the Red Cross Society operating in Germany. In the other cases concerning which the enquiry is now made, it has now come to notice that there was no German field dressing station at Seranvillers, and no trace of any burying ground can be found, nor is such known to the regular inhabitants of that district. It is felt that the Germans had supplied false information, and the matter has been referred to the War Office for investigation. The War Office authorities and the Imperial War Graves Commission are making every endeavour to secure facts. Other regiments will also be affected by the ultimate result of the enquiries; and this Department is endeavouring to find out full available facts concerning the treatment of prisoners by the Germans in that particular sector at that time; and I am hoping that some of the soldiers who fought in that section will be able to reply to my notice in the Press, and any information that comes to hand will be notified to you in due course.
