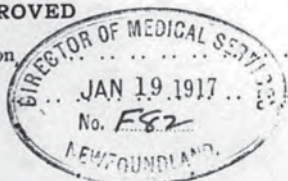

Descriptive Return of a Soldier Discharged on Account of Disability

We have been requested to write you with regard to
the case of one of our members H.M. Walsh #1325, of Bates Hill,
City. 5-1

This man enlisted in March 1915 and was discharged
at the end of January 1917, he claims that for a number of years
he has been endeavouring to obtain gratuity, which he states was
not paid to him at the termination of the War, he does admit having
received something like Ninety dollars (\$90.00) post-discharge pay
only, his claim is that he should have been paid gratuity namely
four months at Seventy dollars (\$70.00) per month.

We have communicated with Major Howley, who informs that
Walsh was not on the strength of the Regiment when the Armistice
was signed and was never on Service outside the United Kingdom, As
we are not intimate with the rules governing payment of gratuity
we shall be glad if you will kindly advise re this case, as doubtless
during your experience as Minister of Militia some similiar case
may have been apparent.

In reply to your letter of 28th.inst.,regarding H.E.Walsh,No.1351,
Royal Nfld.Regiment.,the following explanation will cover the point.

At the time of Mr.Walsh's discharge there was no War Service
Gratuity,but each man on discharge was paid a special allowance known as
Post Discharge Pay. Later when the issue of War Service Gratuity was
authorized,the regulations provided that Post Discharge Pay,where it had a
already been paid,should be considered as part of the War Service Gratuity,
it being obviously unfair that a man who had been discharged prior to the
issue of War Service Gratuity should receive both P.D.P. and W.S.G.

In Mr.Walsh's case,his service would entitle him,under the
regulations,to \$70.00 as War Service Gratuity,but as he had been previously
paid \$104.65 in all,as Post Discharge Pay,there was no payment due him on
account of War Service Gratuity.

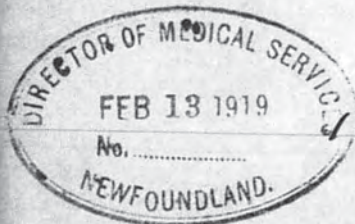

Dear Sir:

I enlisted in the Royal N. F. L. D. Regt the 1st of April 1915, and left here with the draft for overseas the 22nd of the same month. After doing duty at Edinburgh, Stots & Ayr. While at Ayr, I was placed in the R. S. F. Hospital with illness caused while doing duty. I remained there 13 days, and was then sent back to the depot at the recurrence. I was not completely cured when I left for home on the 23rd Dec 1916, and when I received my discharge the last of January 1917, it was as the Doctor pronounced on account of old kidney trouble, but I was still suffering from the illness caused while on duty with the Regt. which was in the form of boils turning to an abscess. I received no pension, and had to pay for my own medical treatment which cost me £22.00. At the time this occurred I was not aware that the Regt

should be paid for this treatment, but I learn since (on good authority) that they were. so I thought it nothing but right, that this money should be refunded to me. I am enclosing Doctor & Druggist's receipt, which I think ought to be guarantee enough that what I say is true. Trusting you will give this your consideration.
