Dear Sir,

in reply to your letter of today informing me of the cheque for £12.40 which was forwarded to me in payment of allotment, I beg to inform you that the cheque mentioned was paid to the proper dependent Mrs Bridget Walsh. My husband being the son of Mrs B Walsh has left her an allotment of ten cents per day since his marriage in December 1918. There has been some mistake at the office however for my allotment from my husband Pte J J Walsh No 918 taken in full with the regimental allowance has always been £7.13 while in Scotland.

As I explained in my letter my last allotment was paid to me in Coatbridge Scotland on May 10th of this year and on June 1st I arrived in St John N.Z.

My Husband was demobilised on June 6th which still leaves me entitled to my full allotment of thirty dollars odd. This should have arrived almost a month ago, so I shall be obliged if you will kindly look up the Records and give me an explanation at your very earliest.

You will find that the mistake has arisen through mistaking my claim for that of Pte Walsh's mother
