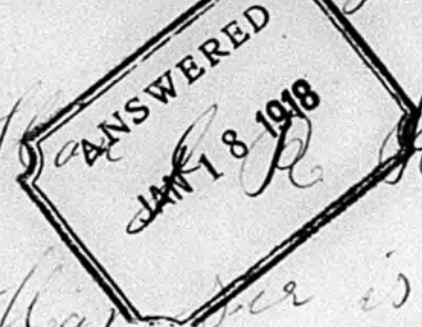

I am in receipt of your letter of the 6th instant and note what you say with respect to your son, No. 1792, Private Michael Walsh, who was wounded on October 11th and is now undergoing treatment at King George Hospital, London.

With respect to your desire that your son be granted furlough in order that he may return home for a visit, I can only say that this matter is entirely in the hands of the authorities in England and is one in which I cannot possibly interfere. Your son's proper course would be to make application to the Commanding Officer and I have no doubt that, if circumstances warrant it, his request for furlough would be acceded to.

Descriptive Return of a Soldier Discharged on Account of Disability.

INSTRUCTIONS—This form is to be completed in the case of every discharged soldier whose claim to pension, on account of disability, is to be submitted for the consideration of the Pensions and Disabilities Board.

This section should be completed in the Hospital at which a man is attending at the time of his examination by a Medical Board, or, if the man is not in Hospital, by the Medical Officer of the Unit or Command Depot. The Soldier should be given a full opportunity of examining it, as, if awarded a pension, his subsequent identification, depends on his confirming this declaration. The "Rank," "Station" and "Date" should be in his own handwriting.

The form will then be attached to the Proceedings of the man's Medical Board and will be forwarded to the O. i. c. Records together with the remainder of the man's documents.

Changes occurring in the description subsequent to the date of admission to pension should be noted in red ink.
