Sir:-

I have the honour to acknowledge receipt of communication to you, from Mrs Patrick Walsh, Placentia. I regret that the report asked for has so long been delayed.

The late Pte. Walsh declared an allotment of 60¢ per day payable to his mother, Mrs Patrick Walsh, and that the allotment is being continued until the question of pension in the case, has been decided.

Form of application for pension was mailed to Mrs Walsh on April 18th. 1917.

The consideration of cases other than those of disabled soldiers and widows of deceased soldiers has not yet had the attention of the Pensions and Disabilities Board, and I understand, it is the intention of the temporary board to allow these matters to remain over to be disposed of by the permanent board to be appointed.



I have the honour to acknowledge receipt of communication to you, from Mrs Patrick Walsh, Placentia. I regret that the report asked for has so long been delayed.

The late Pte. Walsh declared an allotment of 60¢ per day payable to his mother, Mrs Patrick Walsh, and that the allotment is being continued until the question of pension in the case, has been decided.

Form of application for pension was mailed to Mrs Walsh on April 18th. 1917.

The consideration of cases other than those of disabled soldiers and widows of deceased soldiers has not yet had the attention of the Pensions and Disabilities Board, and I understand, it is the intention of the temporary board to allow these matters to remain over to be disposed of by the permanent board to be appointed.

Dear Sir

More than a year is now past since my dear boy and only support Michael F. Walsh Regimental No 339 fell in battle on July 31-1916 and I am still struggling to exist on the \$18.00 per month allowed me.

This amount can scarcely pay for my food fuel and light and as for clothing I am obliged to depend on the charity of my neighbors for it being old and unable to work.

As I understand it the regular pension in cases such as mine is \$384.00 per year or \$32.00 per month commencing I suppose from the date of the soldiers death. This amount will to a great extent relieve the poverty to which I am subjected owing to the loss of my dear boy who was always so good and kind to this mother.

Whilst my grief for his loss shall only cease with my life my pride is also great because of his manly, heroic and patriotic action in laying down his life for those of his fellow subjects who were either unable or unwilling to defend their King and Country and the dictates of common justice against the Arch Enemy.

Finally I respectfully request you
to let me know when may I expect
to receive the regulated pension
and that which is due to make
good same since July 1/16
when my poor Boy paid the supreme
sacrifice

such information even
would relieve my wants
considerable.
