Sir:-

We beg respectfully to submit for your consideration the following facts.

We are operating at South West Arm N. D. B., a rather extensive herring business, packed exclusively by Scotch Method, and have brought from Scotland Coopers and packers for this business.

We manufacture our barrels of standard size and quality, ~~we~~^{and} have a large amount of Capital invested in this business. The Coopers are brought out under a two or three year agreement, and the term of three of these men expired on December last. We were unable to get three others during the past fall, but did succeed in getting two who arrived at N.D.B., in October and are under an agreement to serve until May 1st., 1918.

About two weeks ago, without any notice, these two men, named John Booth and James Watson, came on to St. John's and enlisted in our Regiment.

We wish to point out to your excellency how very important it is for these men to return to their employment. They cannot be replaced. There are no men available in this country who understand the making of Scotch herring barrels and the proper curving and packing of herring, and now none can be induced to come out of this country even if the Imperial Authorities permitted the emigration of such men.

Our business cannot be carried on without them, and the loss will be as great to a large number of fishermen who catch for our stations as ~~to~~^{to} us.

Messrs. Redman Bros. who carry on the business are entirely dependant upon it for ~~a~~^{their} living, and no persons in the country are doing so much

to increase the value of our herring fishery, as they have the expert knowledge, devote their entire attention to their work and produce an article of strictly first class work, We admire the action of these men, who despite the obligation under their agreement are ready to place themselves at the Service of their King and Country, and we should assist rather than attempt to hinder them if it were possible for us to make any arrangement which would prevent the abandonment for the next season at least, of this business.

We respectfully request therefore, that you will find it possible to permit the men ~~to~~ to return to their duties and have them furnished with some document showing that they were refused for no fault or defect.

Booth and Watson Messrs. Bishop's letter returned herewith This matter has been engaging the attention of the Recruiting Committee for the past week and they have been negotiating with the principals of the firm interested.

At a meeting to-day they decided that it was a matter that they should not interfere in.

It is considered that other employes are in the same position and should the authorities exempt these men, who are themselves willing to go, at the request of their employers a dangerous precedent would be established and a basis of argument made which might prove to be a serious deterrent to recruiting generally.

It is felt that the men should be attested in the general way and that the authorities should not take any special action,

The employers are free to employ any legal means to establish their claims. (if any)

It is felt that the issuing of any exemptions or refusals to receive recruits for other than physical reasons would be undesirable just. Now,

Please instruct. Both are single men aged 23 and 25 yrs. respectively and were registered before leaving U. K., If there now they would be in the ranks and they feel that they should be there.

If they do, I am prepared to release them from their engagement and furnish them with a certificate of exemption, provided that they undertake to resume their duties which they have undertaken under their contract with Messrs. Redman, and Bishop Sons, and Co., Ltd.,

With reference to your letter of the 24th ultimo, asking for the discharge from their engagements of Pts. John Booth and Jas. Watson, I have consulted with the Recruiting Committee who strongly oppose the release of their enlistment of these two Scotchmen, owing to the bad effect which their rejection would have on recruiting generally.

I have also consulted with the Prime Minister who agrees with me that I cannot wisely interfere. I am sure that you will concur in the wisdom of this conclusion, despite the inconvenience which is caused to Messrs. Redmond's business.
