I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of February 27th and also receipt enclosed for the cotton bag containing effects which belonged to No. 2675 Pte. L. G. Webb, who was reported missing Oct. 20th 1918.

I note what you say regarding further information concerning your son, and I beg to state that to date we have received no official confirmation of his death, but the usual procedure, is that, in the case where a soldier is missing after the period of six months have elapsed, he is presumed dead by the authorities concerned. The authorities both in England and France are doing their utmost to find out all particulars concerning missing men and if at any time we should get any news regarding your son it will be at once communicated to you.
