In reply I would state that the pay authorized for Orderly Room clerks, Staff Serjts, Quartermaster Serjts under regimental rates, is in accordance with regimental rates of pay published in the Royal Gazette some few years ago, and *which* ~~should~~ have been made to apply to all persons holding these ranks and appointments.

Special rates of pay and allowances were authorized to those doing duty in the London and in this Office. Of course it is very well known that all ranks employed on staff duties and administrative duties, not only in the Newfoundland Forces, but in other British Forces, were in receipt of special rates of pay.

Canadian Routine Order No. 1732 which was adopted by authority for the Newfoundland Forces, provides that Warrant Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers and men employed as clerks on the Hqrs. of an Army Corps, Division, Brigade, etc., or at General Hqrs. 3rd Echelon, and at Hqrs. 



As stated by Lt Wellman it is quite correct that Sgt Grimes recd the rate of pay of Colonel Sgt viz \$180 per diem from the date of his appointment whereas Wellman only recd the pay of O.R.S. viz \$170 per diem. Both however were appointed as O.R. Sgt, Colonel Sgt and rated to draw pay as Lt Genl.

As Wellman was promoted to the rank of Col. Sgt from the acting rank of Sgt, and Grimes from that of the confirmed rank, it is apparent that this was the only cause for the difference in pay. There is no correspondence in Grimes file relating to this.

It would now appear justifiable that Lt Wellman should receive the difference in pay for the period from his appointment to Colonel Sgt, to date of his retirement, viz 22.12.7 - 26.4.19. 491 days @ 10% = \$49.10.

I wish to bring to your notice the following facts for what I make claim for the difference in pay of rank of Sergeant & that of Colour Sergeant.
When employed as orderly room Sergeant, I was paid 1.70 per day and when promoted to orderly room Colour Sergeant, my pay remained the same. The promotion in Battalion orders read - "To the orderly room Sergeant, & to receive pay of the of 'L.A.M. Sergeant.'" I was given to understand at the time the promotion was made when I interviewed the Adjutant regarding the difference in pay that no authority could be obtained to pay me at my proper rank, hence I was still to be paid at 1.70 per day. However when I was sent on an Officer Cadet course Sgt. G. James, who took my place as O. Room Colour Sgt., received 1.80 per day. Therefore if authority was given to pay him at his rank, I fail to see why preference was given to his case & not mine.



Some months ago I sent a claim to the "Enquiries Committee", which claim I understand has now reached your Department. The receipt of my claim was never acknowledged, the reason for which I fail to see.

There are at present at the Militia Dept. two Officers holding the rank of Hon. 2nd Lieut., both of whom were given their full Kit Allowance and are in receipt of a 2nd Lieut's. pay. After spending 7 months at an Officer Cadet Course, we reported to the Pay & Record Office, London, and were given to understand our rank was that of an Hon. 2nd Lieut, but nevertheless had to dress and carry ourselves as Officers, on £20 Kit Allowance, and still receive our previous pay of rank which we held before proceeding on said course. In my opinion, Sir, we are now entitled to the difference in pay of our previous rank and that of a 2nd Lieut, and full Kit Allowance, from date of reporting at Pay & Record Office (Jany. 29th 1919) to date of retirement, seeing that the two Officers referred to above have received their rights. You are no doubt aware that we retired as 2nd Lieuts' and not Hon. 2nd Lieuts'.

The three other Officers who attended this Course with me are 2nd Lts. Dunphy, Claridge and Connors, all residing out of the City.

I have the honour to enclose herewith copy of correspondence exchanged between the Chief Staff Officer and myself, and owing to unsatisfactory replies to my letters I have taken the liberty of forwarding my claim to you for consideration

With regard to mine of Feby 16th and newspaper clipping attached thereto, you will notice that no attempt has been made as far as the reply dated May 6th is concerned to find out if the fact contained in that letter is correct, and as to my letter of May 7th no explanation is given why Two Honorary 2nd Lieuts at the Militia Department received full kit allowance (that is the allowance allowed for officers at home viz. \$15000) and are in receipt of officers' pay, and we who attended a cadet course did not get these allowances when gazetted as 2nd Lieuts. The only reason that I can arrive at for this preference is that we were commissioned from the rank of cadet and the other two happened to be N.C.O's employed as Clerks at the Militia Department. I may say that all Colonial Cadets (Australian and New Zealand) who attended this course with us were gazetted 2nd Lieuts, and received their full kit allowance of \$250.00 and also officers pay, but for some reason we were disposed of in accordance with A.C.Is. 1283 and 983 and A.O. 42 in relation to Imperial Cadets. The question therefore is not what is applied to in the A.C.Is. and A.O. named, for if such was the case why are some officers given preference to others as in this case.

I trust that my claim together with those in the same position will be granted our just rights, and awaiting an early reply.

I am attaching for your information copy of Army Council Instructions No. 083 and 1283 of 1918, and copy of Army Order No. 42 of 1919. It will be noted that telegram of Dec. 5th states that Newfoundland Cadets should be treated in similar manner to Imperial Cadets, under War Office regulations. No subsequent Army Council Instructions or Army Orders on this subject have been issued.

Army Order No. 42 and Army Council Instructions thereto are very clear. In Mr. Wellman's case and in that of a few others this Army Order was exceeded, in that they were paid gratuity as Lieutenants instead of their former rank. He was a Colour Serjt; that meant that he received \$90 and \$93 per month for six months instead of \$70 per month, a difference of over \$120.00

Lieut. Wellman refers to the payment of Outfit Allowance of \$150.00 to two men who were gazetted to commissions and who are doing duty in this Department, and states that no explanation was given to him why these two did receive that allowance. It was not considered that such explanation was due to Mr. Wellman; but for your information I will state that in accordance with the practice of this Regiment (and also of the Canadian Expeditionary Forces) an officer on being commissioned at home receives \$150.00 Outfit Allowance. When Officers proceeded to the United Kingdom for active service, they were allowed a further \$100.00 to provide themselves with camp equipment and other necessaries not required while on home duty. I do not dispute the statement that Australian and New Zealand Cadets were gazetted as 2nd Lieutenants, and were paid \$250.00; but the practice obtaining with the Australian and New Zealand Forces in matters concerning Pay and Allowances, have not at any time been taken as a guide to determine Pay and Allowances for the Newfoundland Forces. A further point is that the two officers referred to by Mr. Wellman are on permanent duty, whereas, officer cadets were repatriated as soon as possible and then demobilised at once

I regret, therefore, that under the present existing ruling, no further payment can be made to Mr. Wellman or other officers in the same category, further than £20 already paid

I wish to bring to your notice the following facts for which make claim for the difference in pay of rank of Sergt and that of Colour Sergt.

When employed as Orderly Room Sergt. I was paid \$1.70 per day and when promoted to Orderly Room ~~Ser~~ Sgt., my pay remained the same. The promotion in Battalion Orders read "To be Orderly Room Sergt. and to receive pay of C.Q.M.S. Sergt." I was given to understand at the time the promotion was made, when I interviewed the Adj. regarding the difference in pay, that no authority could be obtained to pay me at my proper rank, hence I ~~was~~ still to be paid at \$1.70 per day. However, when I was sent on an Officer Cadet course, Sergt. Grimes who took my place as O.R.C.Sergt received \$1.80 per day. Therefore, if authority was given to pay him at his rank, I fail to see why preference was given to his case and not mine

Trust that you will consider my case, and awaiting an early reply
